
### **Skeena River:**

River is very low and in good shape. Most of the Steelhead have gone through but there is still a chance to catch some. Trout and Dolly Varden Char fishing is very good and is available year round. **Reg:** all wild Steelhead everywhere in British Columbia are catch and release. The Steelhead run is very strong. Check out the **Tyee Test Fishery** charts below. Here is a direct link to the [Steelhead chart](#). **Tip:** I suggest the fishing rod be a Gloomis STR 1265c/10'6" MED-HEAVY Moderate Action (GL 2 8-17lb - 3/8 to 1 oz.). Reel Shimano Calcutta (400B) filled with 20lb test Maxima mono. [Gibbs](#) makes some great floats. Be sure to use a Gamakatsu hook. The Coho (Silver) Salmon run is below average. Here is a direct link to the [Coho chart](#). Many anglers are catching both Steelhead and Coho in the same day. The weather forecast is very good over the next few days, so get out there and catch some fish. If you need a fishing guide just [contact me anytime](#).

## **Kitimat Lodge Steelhead fishing report - February 19, 2013**

Another Pineapple Express along the north coast is producing not only mild weather but wild Steelhead as well.

We ran the jetboat yesterday for the first time, the Woodridge coughed and spit as I warmed her up and then she purred. Seconds later we were roaring down river to the first pool of the day. It took only a few moments and the first fish was on, then off! I followed in behind Ariel and send a light pink and white intruder into the deep emerald green water. Mid way thru the swing this small but aggressive hen steelhead boiled on the surface and it was fish on! It took only a few minutes to digitize this fresh hen and off she went, disappearing instantly into its hidden agenda. As we creeped down the pool of Spey desire another steelhead rose to the surface. The fish were active. We tried that same run at days end and Ariel had another great pull with no hookup.



This time of year the rivers are showing their bones and rocks are exposed waiting for aluminum to shine their sharp edges, but not today. We meandered way down river to the Spey fisherman's paradise, my

shoulder crying for relief. I say no way and start fishing another perfect piece of fly desire, the entire river is all ours today. This time I switch to a black orange butt intruder and wham! Another fish on then off. We hooked quite a few fish that day only one made this report.

Attached is another nice Steelhead caught by the only lady of this report and as you can see its a very sizeable male. This time of year the Skeena and Kitimat systems are holding fish and if you find them, chances are you'll catch them. Our remaining pics are of Phil and Jesse two local fellas who are hardcore local anglers and thanks for the pics boys.



Our first Steelhead client of the year will arrive this Saturday, as well fishing on the Douglas Channel is picking up with many Dungeness Crab filling our traps. We have a tentative opening date for Halibut and we could be on the water as early as March 15th. Many bookings are coming in so please book your group as its going to be another good season and we look forward to our old friends joining us as well new ones for the 2013 season.

### **Kitimat Lodge Steelhead fishing report - January 28, 2013**

What a fabulous winter we are having this year. The rivers are in perfect condition and most of the snow has melted here in Kitimat.

Attached are a pair of winter Steelhead and wow are they ever fresh. Today we fly fished one nice pool and a male steelhead chased after a pink and black intruder fly and boy did it give Arch a battle.



Considering the river temps are quite low, this buck burst out of the water at least twice. I expect a early spring and with that early steelhead arriving. The local streams are producing many trout and char and bald eagles perch above in anticipation for a quick meal.

The Douglas Channel has winter springs lurking as we'll many sea gulls feasting on fresh herring. I think that a good herring run dictates the fishery each year.

Our spring steelhead season starts in March thru to late May. Salmon season will begin in May. We expect a early start to our halibut season this April thru to November.

Many bookings are coming in and we look forward to another awesome season here at the Kitimat Lodge.

Tracey tried his best to kill me again today. It is not a deliberate thing on his part. He has tried before. The skipper just has no concept of the aging process and no clue that many of us need more oxygen than kids his age.



Where we park the truck offers no clue to what awaits.

I know we will be fishing a river favored by the warming flow of a confluence of several hot springs...a phenomenon that keeps the river fishable throughout the winter. In truth, the skipper and I have fished the river many times previous at this time of year in years past – both of us breaking into double-digits at times when most anglers have racked their rods on the wall – waiting for better weather. It is this fact that has sucked me in...

"The thing I like best about this run is that no-one ever fishes it!"

Thirty minutes later - walking downhill the entire time -breaking through a three foot deep, crust-capped mixture of snow and slush the whole way, we reach our goal. Downhill was pretty much controlled falling the whole way and we both arrived in a humbled heap, streamside – soaked in sweat and already agonizing about the hike back to the truck.

I'm not even going to describe the agony of the trip back up that cliff. I won't either bore you with the fact the tiny little buck you see pictured above nearly yanked my rod out of my hand on the take or that for the longest time, I thought he was much bigger than his reality. I could quite honestly go fishing every day for the next two weeks, take pictures of each fish I land and describe takes on different flies, but it would all feel like bragging or taunting. In reality – I am blessed to live where I live.

Coming to grips with my own aging is not really the point of my writing this little article. Nor is it describing the landing of another memorable fish. The point of my telling is to attest that the fish that took my fly grabbed it up exactly where Tracey suggested I cast and the fish very near pulled my rod from my hand.

It is probable I would have cast there anyway. After all, I am quite a bit longer in the tooth than the skipper and I have brought more than a few fish to the shore in my time without external guidance. In truth – I would only cast to where the fish was laying as a last resort...only after casting to the 'most likely' spots. Instead, I made a total of 3 casts – throwing rabbit fur at a piece of water most anglers would label marginal at best. The little buck fought with bigger fish bravado and jumped with abandon, but throughout the landing it struck me hard – the student has surpassed the teacher.

### **Kalum River:**

Water very low and a little off colour. Both lower and upper sections are fishing well for Steelhead (see **Top Photo**). This river seems to have all three runs of Steelhead, spring, summer and fall. The fall run, from my experience, is the largest. So if you are coming to the Kalum to fish for Steelhead I would suggest the fall, starting mid September to end of October. This river usually does not freeze over in the winter. It will freeze if conditions are right and that would be if it is very cold and snowing. Slush forms and starts to back up the water when it hits the rocks. This slows the river to such an extent it freezes over. So far so good this year. The fishing guides can guide from April to November 1. If you are interested to book a trip [contact me](#) anytime. Guides and rod-days are very limited on this river so book soon. **Warning:** Jet boater be very cautious as a few new channels on the lower end have formed and logs are nearly across the river. **How to:** This is a good river to float fish a Pink Worm or Goey Bob.



**February 22nd 2013** - Winter Steelheading has been outstanding this year. Warm temperatures combined with large numbers of fish have given anglers some superb fishing and catching days. All the local rivers have been reporting good fishing. Kalum River Lodge's first spring fishing trips start on the 1st April. All indications are for an exceptional spring season so if you have ever considered a spring Steelhead trip with us this is the year to do it!

### **Lakelse River and Lake:**

**Sun Feb 17 /13 5:06pm**

I have a report of some good Steelhead fishing. These are summer-run Steelhead that winter over and spawn in the spring. Trout and Dolly Varden Char fishing is excellent as well. A good number of these Trout head for the lake to winter over. Ice is coming off of the Lake, be careful walking on the ice can be very dangerous.

### **Zymoetz (Copper) River:**

**Tue Jan 1/13 5:02am**

The water is in good shape but has substantial ice flows and is frozen over in some locations. I have had reports of excellent Steelhead catches using both spin, conventional and fly gear. **Reminder:** No fishing above the sign at the transmission line crossing (below) Zymoetz Canyon Jan 1 – June 15. You can still fish below the sign all winter. **Fact:** Last year we had a record run of Steelhead, lets hope we have good run this year. **Tip:** check the **Tyee Test Fishery** charts and see the numbers for Steelhead, they look real good. The fly rods work extremely well in this river. **Where:** Sockeye fishermen are working the bars across from the Copper River. Fly fishing is the choice of many anglers on this river. Wading with quality Simms waders and accessories is the way to go. A friend of mine is very happy with his new **Islander** fly reel. **Tip:** Fly fishermen please wade safely by using a wading staff.

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## **History: 1996**

### **NORTHWEST B.C. WEEKLY FISHING REPORTS**

#### **Fishing Report For November 10 - 17, 1996**



The photo of the week shows my son-in-law Dennis about to release a beautiful Doe Steelhead that he landed on the Copper River November 15/96 using floating line and a small egg pattern fly tied on a size 12 barbless hook. This big Doe was estimated to weigh between 14 and 16-pounds.

Dear Fishing Friends: The main part of our guiding season is over (March 15 through November 5) so all we have left is the odd day booking during the winter. The weather may be bad but the Steelheading should remain GOOD! There are lots of fish around! Just getting access to them is the problem.

Any day now, an article written by Dave Vedder about our spring Steelheading and published in the latest (Dec. - Jan. 1997) issue of the "Salmon Trout Steelheader" magazine, will be out. Watch for it! For those of you who can't get a copy of the magazine, drop me a note, I'll be happy to E-mail the article to you.

**Copper (Zymoetz) River...**Oct. 15/96 My son-in-law Dennis and I fished with some success, even though it was very cold with a high temperature of only - 4 degrees C. We hooked about five Steelhead and landed three. All were Does. My two fish were of average size, between 10 - 12-pounds but Dennis' fish was a big doe that we estimated to weigh 14-16-pounds or even more. See this week's photo. We should have taken a length and girth measurement but forgot, we were so excited to get the photo with the digital camera and quickly release the fish! By the way, I shot some footage with the video camera. Look for it in REVIEW 1996. Dennis was using a size 12 barbless hook. This is a very small hook, the smallest that I have ever used was a size 8. The best thing for catch and release is to use a small barbless hook. Big hooks are more likely to harm the fish. How did you make out Joe Zak? I saw you, Rick and the dog at the 32K hole!

**Note from Noel:** Above is my good friend James Grimes who is a past guest of mine when I had the lodge. I am so happy his friends and family are still coming back to enjoy our beautiful fishery. Here is a report from Jim in his own words:

Halfway through our flight to Smithers the pilot came on the radio and said Smithers was fogged in and we would land in Terrace. We were expecting a little wait in Terrace. Not to be-they announced a bus ride to Smithers. A nice 2-1/2 hour scenic ride parallel to the Skeena river.

They have a new fishing regulation this year that basically closes all the Skeena tributaries to fishing by non-residents on the weekends. You also must buy a tag each day depending on fishing conditions for the river you are going to fish. These tags range from \$20 to \$40 depending on the river. I would be fishing with a fellow named Tim who had fished the rivers last year. We thought we would be fishing the Kispiox the most so we booked a B&B near there. Since the Kispiox was at a forty year low Tim decided to camp in Smithers. This met an hour drive for one of us to meet up each day.

There were two small areas of the Skeena that were open to non-residents so we fished one of them on Sunday in a light rain (the only rain on the trip). Did fish some decent water but neither of us got a fish. Monday we bank fished the Bulkley River with good results. I was 5/7 with a 16lb fish my biggest and Tim was 2/11 with a problem landing fish. Tuesday it was the Kispiox which was extremely low. I managed 3 for 4 with another 16lb buck and Tim was 1/3. The next 3 days we did the same float on the Bulkley where I ended up going 5/14 and Tim got back in the groove and landed several fly fishing and spoon throwing. This was my first experience in an individual pontoon. The river was extremely easy to float except for one rapid at the take out. I got ahead of Tim on the first float and did it all wrong but came out OK with a couple expletives shouted. The next 2 days I followed Tim through.

Saturday Tim and I did some intensive exploring since the Skeena was out and we encountered one bear. Sunday I just packed up and drove back to Smithers for an 8:00 PM uneventful flight back to Vancouver.


