







# **Upstream of signs below lower canyon:**

- Jan 01 May 24 limits 4 per day, none over 65cm. In other words "catch and release" the big ones.
- May 25 Dec 31 No fishing for Chinook.

How to: This is a good river to float fish a Pink Worm or Gooey Bob. I suggest the fishing rod be a GLoomis STR 1265c/10'6" MED-HEAVY Moderate Action (GL 2 8-17lb – 3/8 to 1 oz.). Reel Shimano Calcutta (400B) filled with 20lb test Maxima mono. Gibbs makes some great floats. Be sure to use a Gamakatsu hook. Fly fishing suggestion: Kamloops Dragon fly rod, 10' Kamloops fly reel, AFTMA #8line. Backing Dragon Fly "Bright Orange" 30lb, 150 yard spool. Fly line SA Sharkskin Steelhead WF-8-F.







#### **Robin Rowland** - Visual Journalism and Editorial

Robin Rowland, the editor and publisher of **Northwest Coast Energy News**, first encountered the northern British Columbia wilderness as a toddler on the shores of Ootsa Lake. After a short time in Vancouver, his family moved to Kitimat, where his father Fred, was the assistant property manager for Alcan. For the first two years, the family lived in the old Smeltersite (where from time to time his father would go fishing with others with Haisla guides on Douglas Channel and take the kid along). After that the Rowland family moved to main the Kitimat townsite. After seven years in Kitimat, the family moved to Toronto where Fred Rowland joined the development department of the booming city. Robin attended York University and then studied journalism at Carleton. He worked as a reporter photographer for the *Sudbury Star* and later was hired by CBC News, where he would work for most of his career (with gaps for travel, book writing and six years at CTV News). In 1996, he joined the new CBC news online division. In 1998, he was named web producer for The National and in 2003 became photo editor for CBC News. In 2010, Robin decided to take early retirement and return to northern British Columbia to pursue his interests in photography and writing.

Robin is co-author with James Dubro of *King of the Bootleggers*, about organized crime during the Prohibition era and a follow-up. *Undercover Cases of the RCMP's Most Secret Operative*. In 1995, Rowland co-wrote, with Dave Kinnaman, of Washington State, the first book on how to do research on the Internet. In 2000. Robin wrote *The Creative Guide to Research*. His latest book, published in 2008 is *A River Kwai Story: The Sonkrai Tribunal*.

He founded Northwest Coast Energy News in 2011 as an independent, neutral news website covering all aspects of the environmental and energy issues facing northwest British Columbia from the perspective of the northwest.

Robin also continues to freelance for major media, including CBC News and the Canadian Press picture service. As a freelance photographer he is available for editorial, wilderness and commercial assignments throughout the northwest region. A lengthy section of the report concerns holding some of the hearings in Kitimat. Enbridge Northern Gateway supported Kitimat's concerns, at least for questions of marine shipping.

<u>DFO report to JRP says Northern Gateway pipeline will cross "high-risk" streams</u> but releases only two examples on Kitimat watershed

A Department of Fisheries and Oceans report filed Wednesday, June 6, 2012, with Joint Review Panel says the department has identified streams on the Northern Gateway Pipeline route that Enbridge identified as "low risk" but which DFO considers "high risk." However, in the filing, DFO says it can't release a comprehensive list of the high risk streams, preferring instead to give two examples on the Kitimat River watershed.

The DFO report comes at a time when the Conservative government is about to pass Bill C-38, which will severely cut back DFO's monitoring of the majority of streams.

#### Thu June 7/12 5:10am

Enbridge claims support from 60 % of First Nations on pipeline route; company also sticks to repudiated Gitxsan deal.

Enbridge Northern Gateway says that 60 per cent of the aboriginal communities on the route of the \$5.5 billion Northern Gateway oil pipeline have agreed to accept an equity stake in the project.

In releases to the media today, June 5, 2012, Enbridge says that half of the communities that signed up for a piece of the 10 per cent equity stake on offer are in British Columbia and the other half in Alberta.

There was immediate controversy because Enbridge is refusing to release the names of the communities that have signed up for the deal for "privacy reasons." The controversy was heightened late Tuesday when Enbridge spokesman Paul Stanway said the company's deal with the Gitxsan First Nation still stands, despite the fact both a majority of the heriditary leadership of the Gitxsan and the elected council have rejected the deal signed by one chief Elmer Derrick.

In addition, Art Sterritt, executive director of the Coastal First Nations said that Enbridge's claims about aboriginal equity partners a "sham".

#### Our work cut out for us:

Dear friends,

Now that the wraps are off the Harper agenda, Canadian media has stepped up to the job of unwinding the spin to reveal the gritty truth: Budget Bill C-38 is largely bloody-minded payback for every environmental assessment forced upon industry when it might have profited more quickly had we not taken care to protect our natural capital.

The federal government has so thoroughly gutted Canada's ability to undertake scientific investigation and monitoring that it has sent a clarion call to industry: we won't know if you mess up, because there's nobody left to look. And even if someone does look, there is now little law to stop you.

It came as no surprise last month when salmon farmers Marine Harvest pulled out of the Framework for Dialogue, a co-operative research study on sea lice and closed containment that we began with them in 2009. We had hoped to effect real change in salmon farming practices and progress was unquestionably made on that front, but the salmon farmers caught the scent from Ottawa and see no reason to cooperate for the good of wild salmon and the marine environment.

It is unfortunate that we have to return to doing the old way of doing business, as adversaries, prying information out of government and exposing the cover-ups: escapes, disease and sea lice outbreaks, and marine mammal shootings. We would prefer to find a better way to farm salmon through cooperation, but this is what it looks like when government exercises the raw power of a political majority to its fullest extent.

At **Living Oceans** we have our work cut out for us as never before. Now is the time to stand up for our coast, our oceans and our livelihoods. I want you to know that we greatly appreciate your support as we continue our work for healthy oceans for future generations. Sincerely,

Clark Skips Western Premiers' Conference to Avoid Pipeline, Tanker Talk - by Rafe Mair The refusal of Premier Clark to represent BC at the annual Western Premiers' Conference is a disgrace! This is a very important conference. It allows Premiers to discuss many important issues. No doubt the Enbridge and Kinder Morgan pipelines and resultant tanker traffic will be on the agenda and Clark hasn't the guts to deal with this. This means that when Alberta Premier Alison Redford, who favours the pipelines

and tankers, raises this issue, whether on or off the record, there will be no premier of BC to put our views on the table.


