

Weekly Fishing Reports (Smithers, Terrace, Kitimat, Prince Rupert and Meziadin North)

July 4 to July 11, 2010 Number 175

Dear Fishing Friends:

SUMMARY: Weather has been good but very hot most of the week. This caused the rivers to rise. Most rivers have stayed in shape. A lot of the snow pack is down. Fishing for Chinook (King) Salmon, Sockeye Salmon, Cutthroat Trout, Bull Trout and Dolly Varden Char using both fly, spin and conventional gear has been fair. The Skeena River rose at the beginning of the week but started to drop as the weekend approached. Fishing for Chinook (King) Salmon is fair. The Kalum River is in good shape and fishing for Chinook (King) Salmon is fair. The Kitimat River has been fishable all week but the water has been low. It started to rise mid week. We need higher, rising water for the Chinook to keep coming in. Fishing "out front" the Kitimat Bay (Douglas Channel) for Chinook is spotty while fishing the outer waters for all species of Salmon and Halibut is good. The main run of Chinook is in the river now. The main run has peaked. A few more should come with higher tides and higher river heights. This will also bring in Chum and Pink. Crab (Dungeness and King) fishing is excellent. Check out the Ron Wakita report below. The Zymoetz (Copper) River is in fair shape and fishing for Chinook is fair. Ocean Chinook fishing in Prince Rupert is good. Fishing for Halibut is good and so is trapping Crabs and Prawns. People are catching their limits. Check out the Jeff Carlson report below. Jason Munday in Terrace reported anglers are catching some nice Chinook on the mainstem Skeena River. Check out Jason Munday's report below. Marvin Reid from Mezidian North reports Lake fishing for Dolly Varden and Rainbow Trout is good and the Salmon are starting to show up. Check out Marvin's report below. The Bulkley River is a little high. The fish are at "Idiot Rock" on the Bulkley River. Morice River is in good shape and fish have been seen rolling. Morice River is looking beautiful and dropping quickly. Fish are being caught; a 24lb was landed yesterday on the fly. The Kispiox River is a nice clean green right now. Pretty low water, but is fishing great. Springs are being caught throughout the river. Check out the Bob Melrose report below. Seven fishing guides have submitted reports and photos. Thank you to all guides and anglers who have sent reports and photos. I posted a new Chinook video this week. Fishing guides are offering some good deals to keep their boats floating.



The bank fishermen are setting up on the "Cotton Wood" pool on the Skeena River. A few Chinook have been caught off of the "Lakelse River Bridge". The Sockeye are in the river now and anglers will be targeting them soon. I've heard reports of some caught already.

Kitimat River

Early this week the Kitimat River water level remained low and the Chinook catch rate dropped. Not only were there no Chinook but there were no Pinks or Chum migrating into the Kitimat River either. There was the odd Chinook caught but most anglers were hoping for either hot weather to create snow melt in the mountains to induce river height or rain. Mid week we received extremely hot weather and the Kitimat River water level rose dramatically. The forecast for this weekend is for some showers which would also help remain higher river level heights. With the increase river heights more Chinook have been caught as well as more fish jumping in the pools. Pinks and the odd Chum have also been observed and caught by anglers mostly in the lower Kitimat River. Fishermen and Fisherwomen are always in a better mood when they are catching fish.





July 6 - Ariel Kuppers fishing with Ken Balko landed a 28lb Chinook, 4 Pinks and 4 Dolly Varden on a 1/2 day drift on the Kitimat River. Balko was using a Black and Red 3/4 oz. Rainbow Jig. Well done Ken! Thank You for using our guiding services.



July 8 - Blake Smith fishing with his grand parents Deloras and Arnold Smith landed a 30lb Chinook on the Kitimat River. July 4 - David Payjack of Sea West Fishing Charters reports; "These pictures here are from my last group of clients, Eric Lang, Todd Walker, Dwayne Evans and Jason Cummins. Eric Lang comes to Kitimat to fish with me every year, in hopes to catch huge halibut. He says we don't go for numbers we go for tonnage. Last year he was the first to become a member of our "HALI 100 CLUB" and this year he wanted to beat his previous record of 121 lbs. We specialize in 2 day trips allowing us to get to remote spots where the fishing pressure is minimal. The first lure down at the Hali hole was Erics and within 20 minutes he hooked a Hali weighing 128 lbs! The boys also landed another two halibut weighing 46 lbs and another approx. 20 lbs, 2 nice sized red snapper and 2 ling cod one weighing in the 30's and 1 decent fair sized coho. Awesome trip, sure glad the weather changed allowing us to venture out to our halibut areas." Well done Guys! Great Job Skipper! The Douglas Channel was very productive this week. I spoke to one Skipper who boated 32 Salmon on a 2 day trip. There was a mix of Chinook and Coho in the Salmon count. They also caught 8 Halibut but the largest was 30lbs. This group may not have caught "big" but they certainly caught "lots".

Sue Channel was one of the hot spots for Chinook on the Douglas Channel. The Kitimat Harbour was spotty but the boaters who found some Chinook were very pleased. One aspect of Chinook fishing is that one 30 or 40lb Chinook or bigger can make day's fishing all worth while. The weather early to mid week was unbelievable! We are indeed fortunate to live so close to what I consider one of the most beautiful places on the planet. To be able to catch Salmon, Halibut, Crab and Prawns in calm seas and blue skies is truly amazing. Add to the scenario, the ability to bathe in Natural Hot springs after a day's fishing is an experience that has to be enjoyed by everyone.



Hi Noel, the Meziadin continues to produce some nice fish. I just came in off the lake in time to file this report. I was out with 3 gentlemen, a father and his two sons, Ralph, Ryan and Dion. We did well, catching Rainbows as well as a couple of Dolly Varden.

Sockeye are now entering Meziadin Lake, reports from fisheries is that a good sized run is expected in the next couple of weeks, based on information from the test fishery, near Greenville on the Nass River. I will keep the readers informed as things develop.

Springs are being caught at the mouth of the Meziadin as well. Reports from Kinaskan indicate excellent fishing in the lakes north of Meziadin. Have a great day on the water.

I am now the operator of Meziadin Lake Provincial Park, as well as operating the Park which has a Store, and wireless internet to all sites. We also offer Travel Trailer Rentals to persons wishing to enjoy the outdoor experience.

I do guided fishing trips on Meziadin and other local lakes along Highway 37.

Meziadin if not the best lake in Northwest BC for Dolly Varden and Bull Trout, up to 11 lbs, must be very close to the top of the list. I supply all rods, tackle and bait. Care of catch and cleaning.

Where Have All the Sockeye Gone?

While it is too early to make an accurate estimate of the Skeena's sockeye run this year, the forecasts don't look good. Run size is estimated to be 684,000 to 713,000. That is a far cry from the large record runs of 5,000,000 fish returning to the Babine many years ago.

As of this writing Sockeye are closed on the whole Skeena River downstream from the Babine. This is a very popular fishery on the Skeena especially around Terrace. Many anglers and visitors enjoy this run, when you can catch this most delicious salmon and enjoy the fight on light tackle. This also means no commercial fishery once again, and a curtailment of First Nations Selective fishery. Although many anglers will miss this fishery it does have a bit of a silver lining. If there are no commercial openings it also means that more Steelhead, Coho and Pinks will get past those non-selective nets.

There will be a Sockeye opening on the Babine River of 2 fish per day. This opening is the usual single, barbless restriction but is also fly fishing only, meaning a fly rod and reel has to be used.

Much has been written about BC's dismal Sockeye returns. The returns to the once famous Adams River, the Horsefly, the early Stuart, and the Stellako all on the Fraser system and low returns to the enhanced Babine system are shadows of former returns. Many discussions are held and theories are expounded but little gets done. The catch all phrase, it is "ocean survival" or "global warming" seems to be the easily used excuse. Sometimes it seems that high priced help yields the poorest lame excuses.

I remember a visiting angler who was also a computer geek and took 20 years of Tyee Test Index data and did a graph of daily returns of Steelhead over that three month period. The graph showed the steady climb upwards until the opening of the commercial fishery and that is when the bottom fell out. It stayed that way until the commercial season ended when the graph started a steady climb. A three year old could see the difference. When I showed this to a biologist I was told that the commercial opening had nothing to with it, it was "ocean survival".

As a comparison, up in Alaska the Bristol Bay Sockeye fishery this year is estimated at 39,700,000 fish which is 13% above their ten year average. What about their "ocean survival" or 'Global warming"? Do they come from the same Pacific Ocean?

Sockeye runs on Vancouver Island are also in trouble but a group is trying to do something about it. Water coming out of Great Central Lake is too warm reaching up to 24C. Sockeye die in those temperatures. They want to pipe cold water from the bottom of the lake to cool the river. Warm water is also the problem for our own Stellake, Francois Lake runs and the Early Stuart runs. Another problem is the fishway ladders on the Stamp River. The fish do not use the fishways in the dark but they found that lighting the ladders led to a 5- 15 times more fish ascending the ladders. They didn't stack up in those warm waters with the high mortality rates.

All this to say, we need to run our fisheries management on science not politics. We saw what happened to the East Coast Cod Stocks. We don't need that to happen to our West Coast Salmon. Can we learn from how Alaska manages their fish? Probably. The time for endless talk is now. We need to manage all our wild salmon and Steelhead to the max. If it means curtailing fish farms, stopping gravel extraction or the many other harmful activities to the rivers, so be it.

The Rest of the Salmon Forecast

North Coast Chinook are expected to be as good or better than last year and there has been good reports from the Kitimat and Rupert areas.

North Coast Coho returns may be as good or better than last year.

- " Pinks as it is an off year returns are expected to be lower than normal.
- " Chums will be low to fair.
- " Halibut continues with a daily limit of one fish, possession of two fish.

Prince Rupert

Excellent fishing in the Rupert area. Waters were plagued with the high winds but when the waters calmed it was great. Chinook, Coho and Halibut reported from all areas. This is the busiest time for the guides in the area as it is the best time for getting the big boys with more and more Coho also included in the catch. Great halibut fishing in many areas around Rupert and shouldn't be any problem picking up a couple of "chickens".

Kispiox River

The Kispiox is a nice clean green right now. Pretty low water, but it is fishing great. Springs being caught all throughout the river.

Bulkley River

The river is a little high but the clarity couldn't be better! The skies are blue, the water is green, and its time to get out there. Because of the higher waters you will want to make sure you have the right weights. Guys are using 5-6 oz bottom bouncing at Idiot Rock, and if you are bar fishing anywhere, you will want at least a 8oz or heavier.

Morice River

The river is looking beautiful and dropping quickly. Fish are being caught, a 24lb was landed yesterday on the fly.
